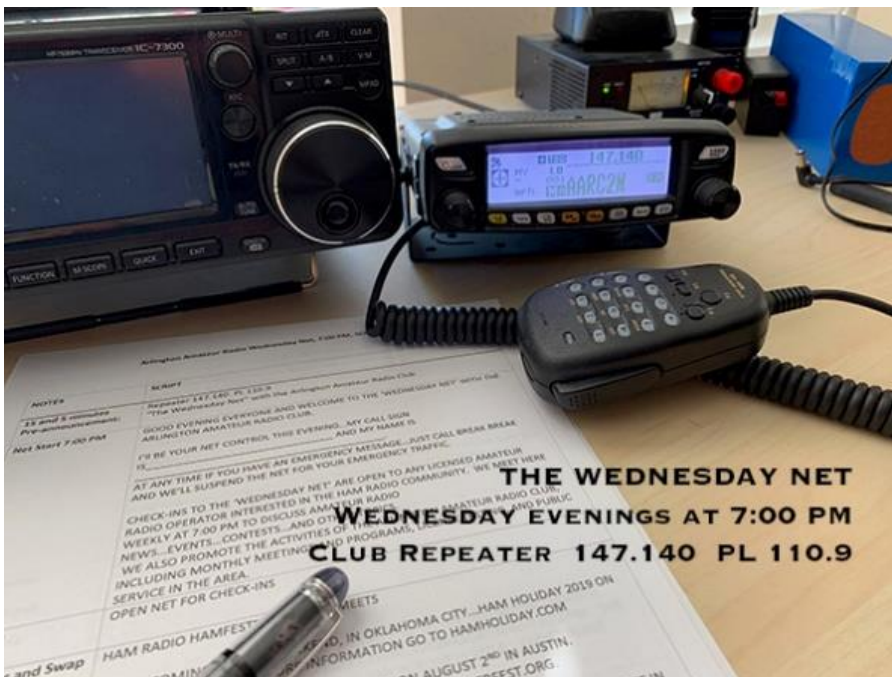

Meeting Minutes

May 2022 Membership Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on May 20th, 2022, at 7:30 pm by the President, Jack AA5VZ, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Other board members present included Vice President, Philip KD5WBW; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order, and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Jack mentioned the micro-grant proposal was approved by the Irving ARC, providing the full amount requested of 50% of the cost of a new electrical generator for use at Field Day. Maurice has ordered the generator.

Jack thanked Lon NL7LE for the presentation at last month's meeting. This evening's presentation will be provided by David Spore KB3UBD on the topic of operating a portable station for Parks On The Air (POTA).

Jack mentioned that the monthly siren test was cancelled due to poor weather conditions. The club picnic will be held tomorrow from 9 am to 2 pm, and Maurice will conduct a fox hunt for those interested in participating.

Philip KD5WBW reported the request seeking a proclamation from the City of Arlington declaring the week of Field Day 2022 as 'Arlington Amateur Radio Club and Amateur Radio Operators Recognition Days' was not granted. The reason being that it was essentially a repeat of the proclamation which was granted in 2021. Philip informed the membership of the opportunity to participate in the Arlington Independence Day Parade, as well as assist with providing communication assistance.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the May newsletter contained the minutes from the April meetings. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report of April 2022. He clarified the item listed as 'Amazon Charity' should have read 'PayPal charity'. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published with the noted clarification.

Maurice will close the Certificate of Deposit and move it to a saving account, as the interest rate on the CD was low.

Maurice successfully ordered the new electrical generator, as well as a 6 gallon extended run fuel tank. This should allow for continuous operation during Field Day, without need to stop to refuel.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for May 2022. All submissions (stories and pictures) are welcomed and requested to be received by the Saturday before the club meeting. He mentioned that Kathleen KG5CVO would be attending the ARRL Teachers Institute.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use the entrance on the north side). The new \$35 fee proposed by the FCC has now gone in to effect, and is collected directly by the FCC from the individual. This fee is in addition to the \$14 fee collected at the time the exam is administered.

Phil conducted a training class on May 9th and 10th, including 10 people from UTA, the Emergency Operations Center, and the Arlington Fire Department.

Bill AE5BT informed the club that Field Day 2022 starts on Saturday, June 25th. Setting up the equipment starts at 9 am. Operations start at 1 pm, running for 24 hours. Packing up the equipment starts around 1 pm on Sunday. Saturday evening there will be a BBQ dinner, and the membership is encouraged to bring side dishes such as potato salad or beans.

Old business: No old business was presented.

New business: Trey made a motion to approve spending \$18.99 to cover the cost of the extended run fuel tank that Maurice purchased for the new generator. The motion carried.

A break was taken at 8:17 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:32 pm with a presentation on Parks On The Air, given by David KB3UBD.

The meeting adjourned at 9:06 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 21 people in attendance, 19 indicating AARC membership. Zoom attendees numbered 5.

May 2022 Executive Board Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on May 20th, 2022, at 6:35 pm, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Present were President, Jack AA5VZ; Vice President, Philip KD5WBW; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order. He mentioned that the club picnic would be held the following day, and Maurice would conduct a fox hunt if there was sufficient interest. Jack and Virginia will bring their equipment for satellite communication. Jack informed the board that the micro-grant proposal was approved by the Irving ARC in the amount of 50% and Maurice has ordered the generator.

Philip KD5WBW informed the board of his interest to acquire signs for the purpose of welcoming the public to Field Day. Philip will ask the membership if they would be interested in entering the Arlington Independence Day Parade. He received feedback regarding his request seeking a proclamation from the City of Arlington declaring the week of Field Day 2022 as 'Arlington Amateur Radio Club and Amateur Radio Operators Recognition Days'. Since there wasn't anything new or different from the proclamation granted in 2021, the request was denied.

Andy KB2VQA confirmed that the May newsletter contained the minutes from the April meetings.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report for April 2022. The fee for renting the post office box has increased. He ordered the new generator and a 6 gallon extended run fuel tank. He noted that the repeater is functioning.

Trey AF5XS published the May 2022 newsletter.

Phil N5PWW continues to hold testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. There are no training sessions being held at this time. Training sessions were held last week, resulting in 9 new hams. The test question pool for the Technician Class exam will change on July 1st. The new \$35 fee issued by the FCC has gone in to effect.

Bill AE5BT mentioned that Field Day 2022 will be held on June 25th and 26th. Amateur radio equipment of a silent key was donated to the club, and Maurice will inventory it.

The meeting adjourned at 7:24 pm.
