Severe Weather Season Is Open

It's springtime for North Texas, and you know what that brings: our annual Weather Season. Do you know where your handheld VHF FM radios are? What about the batteries, do they work? do they hold a charge? What about programming, do you have the appropriate frequencies programmed into your various VHF+ FM radios for the Skywarn nets, with the right offsets and PL tones? Perhaps even consider doing some basic coverage tests with the local repeaters so you have a reasonable expectation for where you can hear them and where they can (and can't) hear you. There's probably very little more frustrating and problematic than having pertinent information about a tornado or other storm phenomenon, but not being able to relay that to the Skywarn net because at the time you don't have enough power, antenna, height, modulation, etc. to get the message across from your present location.

Perhaps you have a 1/4 wave whip antenna on your car; you could discover you need the extra gain from a 5/8 wave antenna in some of the places you drive. Perhaps you have a 5 watt handheld radio plugged up to your mobile antenna; you might benefit from a 50 watt mobile radio. Maybe you need an external speaker on that radio so you can hear it over the road noise and the monsoon and the hail. Maybe you can even put a radio and an antenna in your office near a window. Whatever your situation, take the time now to prepare so you'll be ready for whatever weather comes your way this spring. Tarrant County Skywarn nets operate primarily on the Fort Worth 146.94–repeater (PL 110.9); backups include 146.76–/110.9 and our 147.14+/110.9 repeater. "What is contesting and why should I care?" This is the topic of the first of four sessions the DFW Contest Group is preparing for Ham-Com 2013, DFWCG's George Perkins N5UI reports. Field Day 2013 Plans

For this year's Field Day we have some exciting things planned. We will still be entering the 3A LP category, as we have for the past few years, with 3 HF contest stations, one VHF station, and the one GOTA station on the air. We plan to use networked computer logging software, but we're still undecided on whether it'll be N3FJP or N1MM Logger.

Virginia NV5F will host the **CW** station again this year. It will feature Rob's Elecraft K3 (presuming the issues it's had lately are resolved), along with the Buddipole and 30 foot mast that Dave Lear NE5DL has let us use for a few years.

Terry KD5RA and Phil N5PWW will co-captain the **SSB** station. It will have a Yaesu FTdx5000MP with a Cushcraft MA5B at about 25 feet and a 40 meter inverted V hanging just below. Once evening comes and the GOTA station goes off the air, the SSB station will have a G5RV for 80 meters as well.

Rob NV5E will again host the **Digital** station with his new Kenwood TS-590S, along with the Hustler 5BTV he's used for some time.

Dennis N5ACK will host the **GOTA** station again. It will likely feature an Icom 746 Pro and the club's G5RV all-band wire antenna. Since there are typically no GOTA participants left by shortly after sunset, this station will likely only operate part time, giving its G5RV over to the SSB contest station for the 80 meter overnight run.

Wayne AD5ST will again host the **VHF** station. It will have a Yaesu FT-950 into a 3-element beam for 6 meters. Operation on 2 meters will be limited to FM on a (very) part time basis, primarily for talk-in and NTS messaging, in light of the very low return on investment that a serious 2 meter Field Day effort yields.

We intend to demonstrate the NBEMS suite for NTS messaging on 40 daytime, exchanging radiograms using MT63.

As a reminder, our goal this year is to break the 1000 QSO mark, doubling our results from FD12. We have some very good radios lined up, and our antennas are reasonable enough, so the deciding factor is operators. We need a good overnight shift of operators to keep the main three stations making contacts all through the night, a weakness in the past.

We appreciate your hard work in recent Field Days. Last year we were the second highest ranked North Texas 3A, and with some good planning and effort we hope to give last year's #1 NTX 3A a run for their money. But most importantly, we hope to put forth the very best Field Day effort we can, one we can all be proud of, and for that we need your help.
