Steve Edmonds KZ5MSE, reports on ARRL Mentorfest 2017

Amateur radio operators have a long tradition of helping each other to learn about and gain experience in the many facets of our hobby. Mentorfest 2017, hosted by the ARRL North Texas Section, provided an excellent venue last month for Hams, especially those recently licensed like myself, to gather and learn about lots of radio related subjects. Hams of all ages and experience levels came together in Irving, Texas on October 21, at the Betcha Bingo Hall for a day-long event packed with informative sessions presented by local ham radio mentors or "Elmers".

Having earned my Technician license earlier this year and discovering that I have a rather slow radio learning curve, I arrived early for the first session despite a dire weather forecast. I had already covered some of the more basic subjects like programming my Baofeng handheld using CHIRP and choosing a decent dual band antenna thanks to friend and mentor Don Kovatch, K5YAK. So, I grabbed a seat at 8 AM for Jason K5HWB's presentation on Digital Mobile Radio. Most of it was over my head, but he did paint a picture where DMR, Fusion and D-Star can provide improved FM communication.

My next session, on FSQ: Fast Simple QSO by Paul KA5TYW (check out QST Magazine, September 2015), was really over my head. Apparently, you can download some free FSQ software on your PC and work localized digital messaging with a 2 meter handheld set to 145.670 MHz simplex. Knock yourself out, experimenters!

More my speed were Ken AC5EZ's demonstration on soldering coax connecters, Andy KE5KOF's Anderson Power Pole assembly and Inexpensive outdoor J-Pole construction and testing by Don W9VE. The J-Pole testing was very cool when Don Murray showed his antenna's sweet spot under power with an

antique light bulb. I kept a safe distance.

Back for more punishment, I sat in on Guy N7WSC's session on Digital HF modes: PSK31/JT65 and Paul KA5TYW on AREDN: Amateur Radio Emergency Digital Network. At least I'm aware of this stuff now and think that it's pretty slick the way it works.

Unfortunately Mentorfest was poorly attended due to the timing of competing events. But, altogether, I had a great time. I finished the day by helping Jay Urish W5GM, ARRL North Texas Section, pack up his display table and banners; all the while picking his brain. Heck, I even won an ARRL cap in one of the drawings!
