YLRL National Convention Comes to Oklahoma City

The first weekend of August brought a rare occurrence to the 5 call area. Two Arlington ARC members, Virginia NV5F and Mary KG5URO traveled to Oklahoma City for the national convention of the Young Ladies' Radio League. This convention, which is only held every 3 or 4 years, and always in a different city, came to Oklahoma City for the first time this year. Michelle Carey, YLRL District 5 chair resolved to host the convention in the 5 area a little over a year ago. And no one was disappointed by her efforts.

The YLRL is an organization which dates back to the early days of amateur radio and has a distinguished history. Since membership is limited to YLs, it is a small sisterhood where it's never hard to make friends and everyone seems to know each other. The convention was attended by a little over 40 ladies and with their accompanying OMs attendance was around 70 hams.

Friday and Saturday mornings and early afternoons were packed with inspiring presentations by speakers such as Ria Jairam N2RJ, Andrea Slack K2EZ and Jim Fenstermaker K9IF and included topics such as DMR, roving, the recent DX excursions in Kosovo as well as holiday DX operating and a unique 50 States QSL quilt commissioned by Margie Spangenberg KK4AGN. Nancy Hall KC4IYD, researcher at NASA Glen in Ohio was the keynote speaker at Friday night's banquet. Nancy, a native of Brooklyn New York, is responsible for developing many of the experiments conducted aboard the ISS.

Despite the OKC heat, the ladies and OMs found plenty to do in the afternoons, including a tour of the Oklahoma City Bombing memorial park and museum, the OKC underground and Bricktown, a revitalized downtown warehouse district, compete with canals and a water taxi, not to mention restaurants and clubs.

On Saturday afternoon the YLs held roundtable "Elmira" sessions. The ladies seemed decidedly most interested in the VHF digital modes, while the HF table was comparatively quiet. A few ladies did stop by the CW table, while mysterious topics like FT8 were left for another day. After the sessions, Virginia took a portable setup to the Myriad Gardens, a botanical garden near the Sheraton Hotel where the convention was held. Things weren't favorable on 20

meters but she did make a contact with Idaho! The park was beautiful, and the setup was declared a successful dry run of the portable station.

Others, including Mary, visited local art museums while some just took it easy. And due to the diligence of Michelle Carey W5MQC and her team of organizers the prize drawing was a highlight with every attendee walking away with at least one prize. Sponsors and supporters included DX Engineering, Icom, Diamond Antenna, Radioddity, ARRL and Elecraft.

Many made new friends and new goals for their ham radio pursuits. Mary was most fascinated by roving, so look for her new mobile VHF array coming soon! And Virginia liked OKC so much she has vowed to attend Ham Holiday the last week of July next year.

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on July 20th, 2018 by the Vice President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was the President, Rob NV5E.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. The amplifier which was order from Henry Radio has arrived. Maurice plans to install the amplifier when the temperature is cooler.

The minutes for the June meetings were submitted for publication in the July newsletter. A spelling error was noted in the June 2018 membership meeting minutes. The word "perspective" should have read "prospective". A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published with the spelling correction.

Virginia NV5F let the membership know that this evening's presentation would be on the emergency mesh networking system known as AREDN. Next month the ice cream social and slide show will be held. On Saturday, October 20th, 2018, Bill is planning on participating in Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch. This is an opportunity for the membership to introduce scouts to the hobby of amateur radio.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance). There is a training session planned for August, lasting 3 days at NCTTRAC (North Central Texas Trauma Regional Advisory Council), and it is currently filled to capacity.
