Meeting Minutes

October 2019 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on October 18th, 2019 at 7:30 pm by the President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS (arrived 7:46 pm). Absent was Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Virginia NV5F noted that due to the absence of Maurice KM5RF, we would wait until the November club meeting to review the financial reports for September and October. She reminded the membership that club dues are due at the January meeting. Due to an issue with the repeater, Maurice installed a backup repeater, and the issue with interference appears to be resolved. Maurice will investigate to determine if the issue was caused by a failure of the repeater equipment or external interference.

Phil N5PWW continues to provide testing sessions at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. There are no training classes at this time.

David Walker W5DJO informed the membership of opportunities to assist with the testing of warning sirens within the City of Arlington. The testing takes place on the first Wednesday of the month from approximately 1 pm to 1:30 pm.

Mary AE6Q was not able to contact the presenter of the evening's presentation on the topic of Radio in the Park, so there will not be a presentation tonight. AARC officer elections and a show-and-tell will be held in November. Anyone with a gadget or project can participate in the show-and-tell.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the minutes from the September meetings for publication in the October newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the September minutes as published.

Chair of the Membership Committee, David Spore KB3UBD, is working on scanning various club artifacts to create a digital archive of the history of the AARC. He plans on providing a flashback of club history for publication in the newsletter each month. For the year 2020, David would like to plan a miniature DXpedition for the club, as well as the club picnic and camping trip.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. Submissions of content are welcomed.

Virginia was contacted by the Young Ladies Radio League (YLRL)-District 5 representative regarding the hosting/organization of a kit build project. She has set the date for February 1st, and the kit will be an AM receiver.

Virginia would like to plan a fox hunt for November 16th. She is looking for someone to take the duty of administering the AARC traveling library, which entails bring the box of books to the club meeting each

month. Ballots for Ham of the Year will be accepted at the October and November meetings.

Bill AE5BT mentioned that the scouting event known as Jamboree on the Air (JOTA) was being held during the following weekend. The club would be setting up a station in the parking lot of 501 W. Sanford from 10 am to 3 pm in an effort to communicate with scouts participating in the event. The club plans on bringing amateur radio to the Longhorn Council Camporee on November 9th at Texas Motor Speedway.

The meeting adjourned at 8:27 pm and the membership enjoyed conversation and refreshments. The sign-in sheet showed 24 people in attendance, all indicating AARC membership.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on October 18th, 2019 at 6:34 pm. Absent were Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order. Due to the absence of Marice, the financial report will be reviewed and approved at the November meeting. The backup repeater has been installed, and Maurice will further investigate the cause of the original repeater malfunction.
