# **Meeting Minutes**

January 2023 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on January 20th, 2023, at 7:34 pm by the President, Jack AA5VZ, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Other board members present included Vice President, Torre AA5CX; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Clayton K5CWS; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order, and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Jack informed the membership that Kathleen KG5CVO would be presenting the evening's program on her participation in the ARRL Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology. The club will participate in winter field

day on Saturday next week, and the membership is encouraged to bring their equipment to J. W. Dunlop Park. David KB3UBD is planning the club picnic for May 20th. Jack introduced the two new members of the board, Torre AA5CX and Clayton K5CWS, to the membership.

Torre AA5CX mentioned that Kathleen KG5CVO would be providing the presentation this evening, and David W5DJO would present next month on the topic of assembling a go-bag.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the January newsletter contained the minutes from the November meetings. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Philip KD5WDW, continuing in the role of Public Information Officer, informed the membership of the approaching deadline to enter the Mansfield St. Paddy's Pickle Parade. A motion was made to approve the expenditure of \$50 for the entry fee. The motion carried.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial reports of November and December 2022. A motion was made and carried to accept the November report for audit as published. A motion was made and carried to accept the December report for audit as published.

Maurice is seeking three volunteers to participate in the audit of the financial records for 2022. The repeater is functioning.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for January 2023. Submission of content is welcomed, with the preferred format being a text file or Word document.

In Phil's N5PWW absence, Jack reported that testing sessions continue being held promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use the entrance on the north side). David Walker mentioned that training books are now available.

Clayton K5CWS mentioned that he will contact Bill AE5BT to gather additional information on the responsibilities and execution of the role of emergency coordinator.

Jack reviewed the four club goals for 2023 as published in the newsletter. He would like to see the club membership grow from 54 in 2022 to 75 in 2023, add winter field day and Parks on the Air as club events for 2023, and add two more volunteers for net control of the Wednesday night net.

Old business: No old business was presented.

New business: Trey asked if it was worth the expenditure to keep the Zoom subscription for the club. Maurice suggested that the club renew the subscription and he will collect participation data. A motion was made to renew the Zoom subscription for \$129, and the motion carried.

A break was taken at 8:37 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:47 pm with a presentation by Kathleen KG5CVO on her participation in the ARRL Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 22 people in attendance, 21 indicating AARC membership. Zoom attendees numbered 0.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on January 20th, 2023, at 6:39 pm, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Present were President, Jack AA5VZ; Vice President, Torre AA5CX; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Clayton K5CWS; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order.

Jack mentioned that the program for the evening would be presented by Kathleen KG5CVO on the topic of her participation in the ARRL Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology. He reminded the board that winter field day would be held on January 28th, and congratulated Maurice on receiving the Ham of the Year award. Jack reviewed the four club goals for 2023 as published in the newsletter. He would like to see the club membership grow to 75 during 2023, from the 54 members the club had at the end of 2022.

Torre AA5CX is working on a program on the topic of the terrahertz band. He plans to visit with other clubs/groups to see what they are doing. The AmazonSmile program will soon be discontinued.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial reports for November and December 2022. The bill for the Zoom subscription will need to be paid soon. Maurice mentioned what he would like the club to become involved with a Parks on the Air (POTA) activation. The repeater is in working order.

Clayton K5CWS will coordinate with Bill AE5BT to gather more details on the club's participation in Field Day 2023.
